

Women, don't delay your health screenings



omen often take on the role of caregivers in our society. Unfortunately, they often neglect their own healthcare needs in the process. The pandemic only made things worse as many women postponed important health screenings in 2020 and into 2021 because of safety concerns.

A 2020 study by Epic Health Research Network found that U.S. preventive breast and cervical cancer screenings declined by 94% following the declaration of the COVID-19 national emergency. Between March 15 and June 16, 2020, 285,000 breast exams and 40,000 cervical exams were missed compared to historical averages, a study update found.

It's a pattern UCI Health internist Dr. Lauri Seymour has seen in her primary care practice.

"Most people did not come to the office in 2020; we did mostly telehealth visits," says Seymour, who specializes in women's health and preventive care. Once vaccines became widely available, people felt more comfortable coming in. But they are arriving with long lists of health checks that need to be done, including mammograms and other delayed screenings.

Top health concerns

Seymour has three main areas of concern:

- **Breast health.** The drop in mammography screenings over the last 18 months hasn't helped women's breast health. "I'm seeing a fair number of abnormal mammograms come through leading to an uptick in breast cancer diagnoses," she says.
- Weight gain. Because people have been so sedentary during the pandemic and gained weight, they are encountering related health problems, she says. "High cholesterol, high blood sugar levels and high blood pressure go hand-in-hand with being overweight. People whose labs or test results were normal two years ago are coming back with abnormal results, particularly with cholesterol levels and liver function."
- Mental health issues. The pandemic also has taken a toll on people's mental health but patients who are trying to address their stress and anxiety are encountering long waits to get an appointment with a mental health professional. Primary care physicians can also help. "We are able to prescribe medications for anxiety, depression and insomnia. We can also advise them on vitamins and other natural remedies to help them feel better."

Must-have screenings for women

Seymour, who sees patients in Costa Mesa and also will be practicing at UCI Health — Newport Beach MacArthur, recommends the following:

- A yearly physical. "Every time you see your physician, they should listen to your heart and lungs, check your blood pressure and weight, and ask about your mental health and your particular health concerns." Patients over age 50 should get annual bloodwork, including a cholesterol panel. For healthy women in their 20s and 30s, bloodwork every three to five years is sufficient but they still need an annual physical.
- A well-woman exam. "Women can get their entire physical with us, including a cervical cancer screening and breast exam. I recommend cervical screenings every three years unless the patient has had an abnormal reading." Any serious findings are immediately referred to a gynecologist.
- Yearly mammogram starting at age 40. "Breast cancer is very responsive to treatment when it's caught in the early and middle stages." For women ages 50 to 75 with an average risk of developing breast cancer, current guidelines call for a mammogram every two years.
- Chronic health conditions. Patients with high blood pressure, diabetes, auto-immune disease or other chronic health conditions need to come in more frequently to manage their symptoms effectively and keep complications at bay.
- **Other screenings.** Women are at higher risk for osteoporosis as they age. Women who are age 65 and older should get a bone density scan. Heart disease also presents differently in women. "If a patient has a family history of heart disease or has been diagnosed herself, it's definitely important to keep up with regular heart screenings and risk-factor evaluations."

"Getting the right screening and preventive care on schedule can help you stay healthier longer," says Seymour, "You want to catch health issues at their earliest, most treatable point."

Providence Hospitals in Orange County Provide Exceptional, Leading-Edge Breast Cancer Care

A woman in her 40s was treated successfully for early-stage Estrogen-Receptor positive HER2 negative cancer, a disease that may recur. During the summer, this woman became the first patient to be enrolled in an international clinical trial to help stop her breast cancer from recurring. This "first" happened at Providence St. Jude Medical Center in Fullerton.

"A lot of people don't know that leading-edge clinical trials are available in their community hospitals," said board-certified oncologist Monica Lee, M.D., the principal investigator for this trial at the Fullerton hospital. "Our ability to open trials and identify patients quickly could extend a life and provide much needed hope for those who choose to participate in our trials."

Providence hospitals in Orange County and across Southern California provide leading-edge, comprehensive cancer care in our communities, close to home. Care begins with compassionate guidance through diagnostics, results, care and treatment, all coordinated by a patient navigator who delivers on the Providence Promise: *Know me, care for me, ease my way.*

"Many of our patients are frail, scared, and already confused about how to navigate through the many appointments and departments involved in their care," Dr. Lee said. "Providing additional options for our patients, along with navigators and study coordinators to support them through the clinical trial, removes a huge hurdle for them."

We have OC covered for breast care

Along with Providence St. Jude, Providence St. Joseph Hospital in Orange and Providence Mission Hospital in Mission Viejo and Laguna Beach have the advantage of expertise from across 52 Providence hospitals in seven states, which raises the level of excellence through evidenced-based innovative therapies and access to clinical trials.

From St. Joseph Hospital's Center for Cancer Prevention and Treatment, the first in Orange County to offer preventive services, diagnostic screening and treatment for cancer in one convenient location, to the new Leonard Cancer Institute at Mission Hospital, an integrated network of cancer care, breast cancer patients have access to clinical excellence, dignity and compassion.

Susann Burnett's, R.N., role as a nurse navigator at Providence Mission Hospital's Women's Wellness Center begins well before a diagnosis of breast cancer. She's there to offer guidance and to answer questions the moment a screening mammogram raises a concern. Burnett translates the medical jargon to simple words her patients easily grasp. She looks them in the eye. She creates a bond.

When patients learn of a positive cancer diagnosis, Burnett assures them they're not alone. She provides resources that guide patients and their families through financial counseling, insurance coverage, specialists, social work and support from patients who have been there.



"We try to make this a speed bump, not a major pothole," she said. "That's what navigation is — removing barriers to care."

Whole person care

Providence caregivers treat the whole person, honoring cultures, traditions, personal preferences and an understanding of the patient's expectations while they're under our care. This is especially important for patients with breast cancer who may face mastectomy or endure the side effects of chemotherapy treatments. Anticipating significant changes in our appearance can add to the fear of the cancer itself. At Providence, patient navigators, nurses as well as breast cancer survivors, support you from diagnosis through recovery and beyond.

"Every patient is unique with their own unique circumstances. They're a name, not a number," Burnett said.

For Dr. Lee, it's helpful for patients to know that exceptional cancer care is available in their communities at the hospitals they've grown to trust.

"It's important for our referring providers, communities and patients to understand that we have these options so patients don't have to navigate to another institution for the same care," Dr. Lee said. "We pride ourselves in offering leading-edge care to our patients, and clinical trials provide access to new treatments that may take years to be FDA-approved and on the market."

Alzheimer's Orange County Renames Two Adult Day Health Centers

Alzheimer's Orange County (AlzOC) operates two Adult Day Service centers focused on maintaining healthy aging for frail seniors and those with memory loss, providing occupational and physical therapies, nutritionist guided meals recreation and more. The centers, located near Laguna Woods Village and in Garden Grove, will now operate under a new name but maintain the same programs and services the Orange County community depends on.

Removing the term Adult Day Services, AlzOC has renamed Acacia Adult Day Services and South County Adult Day Services Center to **Healthy Aging Center: Acacia** and **Healthy Aging Center: Laguna Woods** respectively. The new names will better reflect their goal to promote healthy living for older adults and other individuals that need daytime assistance for their health needs, including those with Alzheimer's and other types of dementia. Located in Laguna Woods and Garden Grove, these adult day licensed entities provide exemplary social and healthcare programs with a person-centered approach focused on the needs of local families.

The centers have opened and resumed in-person services modified according to health and safety protocols based on California Department of Aging guidelines. The programs assure a safe and stimulating social environment that supports healthy aging, well-being and independence, while giving family caregivers a vital break, knowing that loved ones are in a safe place.

Services provided by the centers include a nutritious breakfast, lunch, and snack; and comprehensive health supports, including nursing, activities supervision, medication management, and personal care as needed. Activities and exercise are tailored to meet everyone's needs, including arts and music programs; comprehensive therapy; medical supervision for those with physical and cognitive impairment; opportunities for social interaction with peers; and round-trip transportation.


These programs are designed to improve the quality of life of its participants while also offering a more affordable option than in-home care or other health support options families may consider. Funding may be available for individuals meeting program criteria requirements who are Medi-Cal eligible or who carry private insurance. Private pay is also available.

For nearly 40 years, AlzOC has led the way with critical programs and services aimed at helping those living with memory loss. Throughout that history, we have strived to find new ways to maximize our impact and adapt to meet our community's health and wellness needs through unique programs like Adult Day Health Care Centers – now Healthy Aging Centers. This name change symbolizes our organization's commitment to that idea and helping Orange County's older adults and others that can benefit from these programs.
