
Since incorporating 50 years ago in 1971, Irvine has grown from a master-planned community to a forward-thinking City focused on diversity, equity, and inclusion.

When the Irvine Company announced plans for the largest planned city in the Western Hemisphere in 1970, everyone took notice. The proposed City would include 53,000 acres; be twice the size of San Francisco; and prioritize family, safety, environment, and community. The following year, December 28, 1971, the City of Irvine was incorporated.

Irvine has grown from more

than 10,000 residents in 1971 to more than 307,000 residents in 2021. It is now home to more than 17,000 businesses and several robust industry clusters including life sciences, information technology, aerospace, advanced manufacturing, and digital arts and media. Irvine is committed to protecting native and endangered species that call the Irvine Open Space Preserve home and continues to prioritize climate change initiatives that value our region's natural resources.



Irvine began as a City rich in agricultural and military history, and continues to be a community in which cultural diversity is celebrated and supported through arts, programs, special events, and multilingual and multicultural outreach efforts. The City remains committed to embracing all cultures, individuals, and ethnic groups as a fundamental principle to its success and future growth.

Diversity, Equity, Inclusion for All

Irvine has long been recognized as one of the most ethnically diverse and fully integrated cities in the country. On January 26, 2021, the Irvine City Council unanimously adopted We Are Irvine — a diversity, equity, and inclusion resolution reaffirming residents, businesses, and visitors have access to fair and equal opportunities.

Through this resolution, the We Are Irvine initiative was developed. As a result of this effort, the City has created collateral materials in the top eight languages spoken and read in Irvine, ensuring that all outreach and events are accessible to its diverse residents.

The City has also sought cultural experts' advice on multilingual communication practices and leveraged nonprofits and educational partners — including South Coast Chinese Cultural Center (SCCCC), Orange County Asian and Pacific Islander Community Alliance (OCAPICA), **Orange County Multicultural Institute** for Development (OMID), Abrazar, Irvine Public Schools Foundation, Korean American Center, UC Irvine, Irvine Valley College, and more — to better connect with residents and communities throughout the City.



Did You Know?

- Irvine offers marketing and resources in Farsi, Korean, Chinese (simplified and traditional), Japanese, Spanish, Vietnamese, and Arabic with plans to add more translations.
- The City's website is available in more than 80 different languages.
- A translation language phone line has been implemented, allowing any caller or visitor to access City information and services in their preferred language.
- The We Are Irvine lecture series pilot program is underway, offering an introduction to local government and City resources to Chinesespeaking newcomers. Additional lecture series targeting more communities in Irvine are in development with local partners.
- Irvine supports active international programs and has sister city relationships with Tsukuba, Japan; Hermosillo, Mexico; Taoyuan, Taiwan;

- and Seocho-gu, Korea.

Irvine Police Department Stays Innovative to Keep City Residents Safe and Protected

Irvine is one of the safest cities in America, with the lowest rate of violent crime per capita of any city in the nation with a population of 250,000 or more. The Irvine Police Department continues to provide innovative and creative ways for the public to connect with police, including: video conferences to report crime, an online portal to submit police reports, and free bicycle registration through Project 529 in the event of theft.

The Irvine Police Department also works hard to keep residents protected from natural disasters and emergencies, recently launching an updated all-hazard evacuation map and a unique Hi/Lo Siren to alert the community in the case an evacuation is needed.

Coming Together During COVID-19

The City of Irvine has been on the forefront of the fight against COVID-19 from the very start of the pandemic. It launched a COVID-19 Task Force, established a helpline email for community questions, and partnered with local government agencies to effectively communicate daily health updates and advisories to residents.

The City's Emergency Operations Center activated for more than 480 days — the longest in Irvine's 50-year history — to coordinate resources, information, and crisis communications amid the pandemic. The Irvine Cares campaign encouraged residents to wear a mask and get vaccinated, and resulted in thousands of individuals and businesses pledging to protect themselves and their neighbors.

The City of Irvine shifted many of its services to virtual formats to support residents' well-being and ensure the ongoing health and safety of the community. Residents can submit requests through the Access Irvine app, participate in civic meetings through Zoom, and manage permit requests through IrvineREADY!

Through partnerships with local health agencies, the City has:

- Hosted 24 vaccination clinics
- Operated a drive-thru mass-vaccination clinic at Great Park
- Administered more than 13,500 vaccinations
- Achieved a vaccination rate of more than 80%
- Achieved the lowest positive testing rate in the county



A Good Connection is Music to Your Ears

Singer/Songwriter Giana Nguyen didn't exactly set out to own a nontraditional music studio with primarily children as students, but that is exactly what happened when she opened Dancing Keys Music Studio in Irvine.

In 2012, Nguyen was focusing on her music career when her former business partner found her online after hearing one of her songs playing on a local radio station. He sought her out for her contemporary style. A longtime pianist, at the time she was teaching piano to a few students from home and seeking new business opportunities. He approached to collaborate, and she jumped at the opportunity.

Together with a third partner, they opened Dancing Keys Music Studio in March 2013 as the only commercial studio in Orange County to specialize in the Australian-developed piano method from Simply Music, the world leader in playing-based music education. In the years since opening, Nguyen has transitioned to be the sole owner of the studio but she and her team have continued to bring this multi-sensory piano approach to families throughout the region. In early 2020 this approach was amplified by the COVID-19 pandemic when the studio that only offered in-person lessons had to quickly close and pivot to online instruction.



"We had our own spring break in a sense where we didn't teach lessons and figured out how to keep serving our students," explains Nguyen. A mic stand with a smart phone clipped onto it could serve as an overhead camera and Zoom would become the new classroom. She went to a local music store to buy all the equipment and pulled together her instructors for technical training and

implementation. In one week, the business shifted completely online with all instructions taking place remotely.


"Our community of students and parents are very resilient, adaptive, and everyone jumped on board."

She adds, "Cox Business internet has been the ticket to making this all happen. There is no way we would be able to do this without a fast and reliable broadband connection."

Dancing Keys Music Studio was able to provide virtual lessons throughout the 2020 shut downs and her client base grew as more parents wanted to find a way to keep their children engaged safely in STEAM activities. "Music really served as an outlet during this hard time for students and instructors alike," said Nguyen.

This sentiment was on full display for the community in December of 2020 when the studio hosted a Zoom holiday showcase. Parents decorated or created backdrops in their own homes for when their child was spotlighted on screen. They were able to connect and cheer each other on via the platform. This past June as California re-opened, Dancing Keys Music Studio hosted an outdoor concert in the courtyard of Woodbridge Village Center for students' families and the community at large. These "Piano Parties" have always served as catalyst for students to publicly showcase the joy of music.

Earlier this year, following the state lifting mandates on operations and masks, Nguyen started operating as a hybrid studio where students can take both virtual lessons at home or in-person lessons at the Woodbridge Village Center location. She even has group lessons where one student participates from home and the rest in her studio. As of August 2021, sixty percent of her students are doing virtual lessons and the team still utilizes technology, physical distancing, air filters in each room, and a robust cleaning schedule for in-studio lessons.

IRVINE: THE CITY OF EDUCATION

It's not surprising that Irvine is one of the best places in the nation to receive an education, from K-12 to Ph.D. More than six decades ago, Irvine was master-planned with education in mind. Visionary city leaders knew that prioritizing education would be the key to the city's long-term economic vitality and quality of life, so they designed the city around a research institution — known today as the University of California, Irvine (UCI).

As the city has developed, so has its portfolio of outstanding schools, colleges, and universities. Today, there are 15 colleges and universities that have a physical presence in Irvine:

With an abundance of post-secondary education options, Irvine is home to a highly-educated community. According to a 2020 **U.S. Census Bureau** report, about 69% of adult Irvine residents have a bachelor's degree or higher, more than double the national (32%) and state (34%) figures. Moreover, the quality of the education students receive here is exemplary — a fact numerous rankings confirm.

UCI is one of the world's leading education and research institutes. More than 37,000 students enrolled last year — approximately 29,600 undergraduates and 7,3745 general and health sciences graduate students. UCI has been ranked a Top 10 Public University seven years in a row by U.S. News & World Report, the #1 Best College in the U.S. by Money in 2019, and a Top 10 Cool School in the U.S. for Sustainability by Sierra magazine for 12 years.

The New York Times named UCI #1 among U.S. universities **Doing the Most for the American Dream** in 2017 and 2015 College Access Indexes. The ranking measures economic diversity based on several factors: the share of students receiving Pell Grants (which typically go to families making less than \$70,000 a year); the graduation rate of those students; the net cost, after financial aid, that a college charges low- and middle-income students; and endowment per student.

Orange County's premier private university, Chapman University, serves nearly 10,000 students annually — approximately 7,400 undergraduate and 2,300 graduate students. Chapman is ranked #37 (tied) for Best Undergraduate Teaching, #57 for Most Innovative Schools, and #122 (tied) in National Universities by U.S. News and World Report. The university's Dale E. Fowler School of Law has been ranked in the nation's Top 10 law schools for best quality of life and #134 overall by The Princeton Review. Chapman is also recognized for its Argyros School of Business, Crean College speechlanguage pathology programs, and others. The Hollywood Reporter ranks Chapman's Dodge College of Film and Media Arts the #4 Top American Film Schools.

Chapman's Harry and Diane Rinker Health Science Campus in Irvine is home to the highly-ranked School of Pharmacy and several graduate programs within the Crean College of Health and Behavioral Sciences.


A College for the Community

Students can enter post-secondary education at a community college with one of the region's highest transfer rates to UC schools, and is an affordable option: Irvine Valley College (IVC). With the Irvine Valley Promise, IVC offers eligible first-time, full-time IVC students two years of free tuition, bookstore vouchers, designated counseling resources, and other resources to help them succeed. This past year, IVC offered more financial aid than ever – more than \$20 million, including scholarships, grants, and work-study.

Each year, IVC serves 22,000 students from Irvine and local communities and offers more than 100 career-ready degrees and certificates, and pathways in 21 in-demand industries.

Educating Irvine's Youth

Irvine's youth are prepared for higher learning at some of the nation's finest K-12 schools.

Irvine Unified School District (IUSD) high schools have been consistently ranked top in the nation by Newsweek's List of America's Top High Schools. It serves about 36,000 students annually through 40 schools and other programs. IUSD has ranked among California's highest performing school districts in math and English language arts and literacy for the past two years, outperforming Orange County and State score averages. IUSD schools have been awarded



the California Distinguished Schools/Gold Ribbon designation 77 times since 1986. IUSD high school SAT scores consistently rank top in Orange County and the state.

More than 96% of Irvine residents have graduated from high school, exceeding the national figure of 88%

IUSD is the fastest-growing school district in California. Since 2012, IUSD has opened eight state-of-the-art schools:

- Jeffrey Trail Middle School (opened in 2012)
- Cypress Village Elementary School (2014)
- Portola Springs Elementary School (2015)
- Portola High School (2016)
- · Beacon Park School (K-8) (2016)
- Eastwood Elementary School (2017)
- Cadence Park School (K-8) (2018)
- · Loma Ridge Elementary School (2019)

Irvine's newest school, Solis Park School (K-8), located at the north end of the Great Park Neighborhoods, officially broke ground in September and is expected to open in 2022.

Community Partners

In addition to Irvine's world-class schools and distinguished educators and administrators, community partners ensure our students have access to quality programs and auxiliary opportunities.

Over its 25-year history, the Irvine Public Schools Foundation, the largest education foundation in California raising funds for public schools, contributed more than \$90 million in program and financial support to IUSD.

The Greater Irvine Chamber supports student learning through scholarships and career readiness programs such as its award-winning Career Edge soft-skills series for students attending colleges, universities, high schools, and academies in Orange County and Southern California. The Chamber's semester-long Ethics Forum, for Irvine high school students, is designed to teach students the process of ethical decisionmaking, using common ethical dilemmas to determine criteria and respond appropriately.

The Greater Irvine Chamber celebrates Irvine's world-class education as part of what helps the city live up to its promise as a model master-planned community and its ability to sustain economic vitality by ensuring a continued skilled workforce.

During its Oct. 13 Distinguished Educators event, the Greater Irvine Chamber will recognize outstanding Irvine educators and STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics) programs offered in the city.



Fifty years ago, when residents of the then-unincorporated community of Irvine voted to become Orange County's 26th city, Daily Pilot reporter George Leidal compared their journey to another historic milestone.



The study found that SSI were found in 0.6 percent of patients who underwent surgery at a tertiary hospital and 0.2 percent in patients who underwent surgery at an orthopedic specialty hospital.

This study underscores why it is so important for patients to do some homework about the hospital or facility that their orthopedic surgeon selects for their surgery. Infection control measures at Hoag Orthopedic Institute are robust and meaningful and the process of ensuring better outcomes and reducing infection risk begins way before your surgery, including immunizations, vigorous testing and at-home measures.

Between each surgery, HOI uses a robot to eliminate germs in the operating room among a host of other additional infection control measures.



The Travel & Tourism Industry Plays A Critical Role in Restoring the Economy

The COVID-19 pandemic caused global economic hardship, with the

travel industry being the hardest hit, even more so than it was during the Great Recession. Prior to the pandemic, travel spending in Irvine contributed nearly \$781 million to the city's economy, supporting nearly 6,000 jobs and generating nearly \$50 million in state and local tax revenue. In 2020 there was a nearly 57% decline in travel spending and a loss of approximately 1,570 jobs, proving just how important the economic impact of corporate meetings and sporting events are to the Irvine community.

According to the 2019 and 2020 Visitor Impact reports conducted specifically for Irvine and the State of California by Dean Runyan Associates, on behalf of Destination Irvine and Visit

California, Orange County as a whole also saw travel spending decrease by

57% year over year. In comparison, the U.S. travel industry contracted 36% in 2020, whereas California's travel economy declined 55% from \$144.9 billion in 2019 to \$65.1 billion in 2020.

Despite losses due to the coronavirus pandemic, Orange County is well-positioned for recovery due to the state reopening, U.S. vaccination numbers continuing to increase, and the lifting of pandemic-related restrictions. Leisure travel continues to rise with more than three-quarters of Americans planning to take a trip this summer, signaling that pent-up demand generates bookings.

Destination Irvine's role of marketing and selling Irvine as a preferred overnight destination for groups, sports events, leisure visitors, and business travelers plays a significant role in the recovery of travel to the city and lending to increased visitor spending for the betterment of the community.

Group business is returning to Irvine. May was the fourth consecutive month our destination sales team received more than 20 leads for future group



business, the most since March 2020. In the past four months, Destination Irvine has booked nearly 4,900 room nights worth nearly \$1.5 million in economic impact for the city.






Hosting a Meeting in Irvine Supports the Local Economy & Enhances the Quality of Life for Residents

Why and How the City of Irvine Was Formed

A Master Plan for development of the Irvine Ranch was created by the architect William Pereira in the early 1960's. This Master Plan provided for future developments of residential, industrial, and commercial properties on the Irvine Ranch. As a result, the Irvine Company marketed land in the Irvine Industrial Complex and properties were sold to major industrial companies such as Lockheed, McDonnell Douglas, and Collins Radio.

Portions of the Irvine Industrial Complex were adjacent to the cities of Newport Beach, Costa Mesa and Santa Ana. These cities annexed portions of the Irvine Industrial Complex to obtain property tax revenues. The remainder of the property was under the jurisdiction of the County of Orange.

Some of the first residential developments on the ranch in the 1960's were The Villages of University Park and Turtle Rock. In 1969 a group of residents living in those Villages were concerned that additional annexation of the Irvine Industrial Complex land by the other surrounding cities would result in higher property taxes on the residential properties remaining in the County. The reason for this is that industrial land produces a higher tax base than residential land and provides more tax revenue to support city services.

The residents created an organization called COIN which was shorthand for "City of Irvine Now". This organization did the financial analysis and filed an application with the County of Orange, Local Agency Formation Commission ("LAFCO") to form the City of Irvine. This application created a huge political issue because the County of Orange Board of Supervisors wanted to retain control over the Irvine Ranch.

COIN hired me to represent the organization to create the new City of Irvine. The first issue that had to be resolved was an existing agreement between the the Irvine Company and the City of Santa Ana which obligated The Irvine Company to annex portions of the Irvine Industrial Complex into the City of Santa Ana. We filed a lawsuit contending the agreement was invalid because the state legislature created LAFCO and was the final arbiter of city formation in the State. We won that case and resolved the issue.

The formation of the City required hearings before LAFCO. The members of LAFCO were two members of the Board of Supervisors, Mr. Ron Caspers and Mr. Robert Battin, along with various representatives from cities within the County of Orange. One city representative from the City of Anaheim was Charles Pearson who supported the formation of the City of Irvine.

Prior to the final hearing of LAFCO on the proposed City of Irvine, the Board of Supervisors attempted to remove Charles Pearson and replace him with a City Councilman who opposed formation of the city.

We heard about this on the Friday prior to the Monday meeting of LAFCO. We filed a restraining order with the Superior Court and were prepared to serve the two supervisors prior to the LAFCO meeting on Monday. The supervisors attempted to evade service of the restraining order and tried to call the meeting to order and move to replace the Anaheim representative as they were walking into the meeting room. We were able to serve them as they were walking into the meeting. We told the County Counsel, who was representing LAFCO, that we set a hearing that afternoon before the Superior Court to hold the members of LAFCO in contempt for their actions. The County Counsel advised the LAFCO members that this was not in their best interest.

The rest is history. LAFCO approved the application, and an election was held resulting in the formation of the new city in 1971.





Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, many of our neighbors in Irvine found themselves in need of assistance for the first time. Orange County United Way worked with the City of Irvine

s the City of Irvine commemorates its 50th anniversary, Irvine Barclay Theatre's Board of Directors, staff and volunteers honor and thank the City for its commitment to making world-class performing arts available to everyone in our community.

For more than 30 years Irvine Barclay Theatre and the City of Irvine, together with the University of California, Irvine, have worked together in a unique and, at the time, first-ever public-private performing arts partnership. When the Barclay opened to the public on September 30, 1990, it was the culmination of 17 years of determination and hard work by community volunteers, business leaders and the City's staff and elected officials.

The Barclay project began as one part of a 1974 park bond measure approved by Irvine voters. The initial bond funding allocated \$1.5 million to the construction of a community theater. Over the course of more than ten years, as supporters of the theater struggled to find a site for their cultural vision, the City developed the extensive selection of parks, sports fields, aquatic centers and senior

centers that help make life in Irvine so enjoyable for so many.

Despite the challenge of finding an appropriate site, Irvine's then-Mayor, Sally Anne Sheridan, and other City of Irvine elected officials remained committed to the importance of a community theater. Their persistence led them to forge a partnership with UCI's then-Chancellor, Jack Peltason. Through that partnership UCI provided the land on which the theater is built.

Dick Sim, an Irvine Company executive and founding Chairman of the Irvine Barclay Theatre Board of Directors, along with Tom Nielsen, Chairman of the Barclay Board of Trustees brought together Irvine businesses and residents eager to see the curtain rise on a community theater - raising more than \$4.8 million for the project. The City of Irvine added additional funding and brought construction expertise to the project. And then, in December 1988, construction began. Nearly two years later the \$17.6 million state-of-the-art Irvine Barclay Theatre finally evolved from vision into reality.

Jerry Mandel, the respected and award-winning Orange County arts veteran, now oversees Irvine Barclay Theatre as President and Chairman of the Board. He leads a group of volunteer directors that reflects the theater's original partnership structure, with representatives from the City, the university and the community working together to ensure the venue fulfills the promise of its mission: to broaden the scope, availability, and appreciation of performing arts for the benefit of Irvine's residents and those in neighboring Orange County communities.

"We are deeply thankful and grateful for the City of Irvine's vision, creative partnership with us and with UCI, and its on-going support over the past 30 years," said Mandel. "Irvine is a culturally diverse community that has embraced the performing arts, and the City's strong commitment to the performing arts ultimately made it possible for the Barclay to be built and to thrive."

Designed by the San Francisco architectural firm Wurster, Bernardi & Emmons, the intimate 750-seat "jewel box" theater includes a dramatic entrance plaza with a water feature, a two-story lobby, professional stage, orchestra pit, and highquality production facilities, including a superior acoustical environment. The building is named after Richard Barclay, an area philanthropist who provided a lead gift for the theater's construction. The auditorium, Cheng Hall, is named for the late local philanthropists Dr. George and Arlene Cheng.

Today, Irvine Barclay Theatre is one of California's most imaginative and innovative performing arts venues. A magnet for music, dance, theatre, and other arts patrons throughout Orange County and Southern California the theater has

> welcomed more than three million visitors who experienced a broad array of performing arts programming with top performers in a wide range of disciplines and genres.

> Over the years, the Barclay has become nationally respected for its intimate atmosphere and superb acoustics which create a superior audience experience of the world's best performers. In addition to a recent appearance by world-renowned soprano Renée Fleming, which was co-presented by the Philharmonic Society of Orange, Barclay seasons have included National Geographic Live, fascinating presentations by leading explorers, scientists, photographers; classic ballet and contemporary dance; a variety of music genres, including one of the leading jazz series on the

West Coast; and a speaker series with esteemed authors and other thought leaders.

During the pandemic shutdown of the 2020-21 season, Irvine Barclay Theatre took the opportunity to make many improvements to the auditorium for the comfort of our patrons, including installing new seats and carpet, and upgrading its HVAC system and air-handlers to use hospital-grade filters throughout the building. On September 19, the Barclay launched its new season, raising the curtain on a schedule of live performances for live audiences for the first time in almost two years.

Thank you, City of Irvine, we have enjoyed the first 30 years of our partnership. We look forward with great excitement to the next 30. We couldn't have done it without you!


discreet delivery of prescriptions. They also provide mental health services through secure telehealth channels to minimize face to face contact.

Irvine Home to #1 Jewish School in America

In 1991, Irving "Papa" Gelman, a Holocaust survivor and longtime benefactor of education, transformed Jewish Studies Institute into Tarbut V'Torah Community Day School (TVT). Tarbut, which means culture in Hebrew, was the name of the school Gelman attended as a child in Poland. TVT's first location was an office building in Costa Mesa with only 36 students in grades Kindergarten - 6th grade



before moving to its current campus in 1997. In 2002, the Upper School Campus opened in Irvine, allowing for the expansion of enrollment in grades from Transitional Kindergarten - 12th Grade.

When "Papa" Gelman stood in the corner of his backyard in Irvine, looking out onto what was an open field, he knew that it would become the incredible school that it is today, now with over 760 students enrolled. On the day of the groundbreaking, "Papa" Gelman had his golden shovel in hand, and the small group of attendees were wearing white caps with the words "If you build it, they will come' embroidered on them. "Papa" Gelman was a true believer in that adage, and he envisioned a Jewish Community Day School, TVT, which would later become the #1 Jewish School in the United States.


